GWOCPC CONVENTION COMMITTEE MEETING – Thursday, March 26, 2009

President Suzanne Painter called the meeting to order at 12:15 PM at the Blue Willow Inn Restaurant in Social Circle, Georgia immediately following the regular Board Meeting.

Suzanne reminded us that our Convention at Callaway Gardens is just about six weeks in the future and encouraged us all to make our room reservations at the Mountain Creek Inn, and encourage others to do so, in order that we meet our room night requirement in our contract.

Eleanor Weiss reported that she is working on collecting items for the homemade auction and told us that baked goods are welcome. Eleanor asked us to talk up the homemade auction at our various clubs. She said she will be at Callaway Thursday morning, opening day of the convention, to set up and accept items which you have not already gotten to her. The Homemade Auction will be Thursday night after the 6PM Reception in the Conference Center behind the Mountain Creek Inn.

Suzanne told us that the banquet and all food events will be in the Inn. Also she told us there is a parking lot behind the Conference Center where all other activities will take place. There is plenty of parking so it should not be a problem to go up the hill.

Suzanne reported that there will be several different selections of hors d'oeuvres, both hot and cold, and a cash bar at the Thursday night reception.

Booth holders will start setting up at 7:00 AM Thursday morning. Paint-ins will begin at 10:00 AM and end at 1:00 PM that same day and will be \$35.00 each. It was decided that a minimum of six people will be required to hold a paint-in and twelve will be the maximum. Each person will paint either a pendant or a plate and this item will be supplied free of charge by Dallas China Company.

Lynette Peterson, Table Decorations Chairman, reported she purchased 53 figurines similar to the Royal Doulton ladies. They are currently being painted or have been completed by several members of GWOCPC. They are turning out quite pretty and will be for sale for \$10 for the small ones and \$12 for the large ones at the convention. This is a real bargain but we will be making money on them since Lynette got a great deal from Freddie's on a close-out. You may purchase the one you painted but you must tape your name on the bottom so it will not be sold to anyone else. You may bring your completed figurines to Lynette at the convention if you cannot get it to her earlier (which would be preferable).

Bonnie Mellin reported that each club president will receive a form to fill out and get back to her by April 15th at the latest, which will show how many tables your club will need for their regular display of china, and pieces to be judged. Also Carol Derflinger will send a form you must return by April 15 which will show how many items your club will provide in all other areas (sales table, silent auction, raffle, homemade auction, etc.).

We plan to have a meeting with Linda Hubbard of Mountain Creek Inn no later than April 20 and she will be helping us with the entire exhibit room floor plan so IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT YOU GET THESE FORMS BACK TO BONNIE AND CAROL.

It was suggested and decided that we will have a table for pieces you painted at Tybee Island at Seminars By The Sea. Please bring these so that everyone can see what beautiful pieces are being painted in these classes. Suzanne will have a booth promoting Seminars By The Sea and that will be an opportunity for us to bring new students into our fabulous school (the best of all schools according to Celee Evans).

Suzanne will assign someone to man the raffle table. Tickets will be \$1.00 each or 6 for \$5.00 just as we have done this in the past. Each club is painting a vase for the Raffle. It was suggested that the Sales Table be next to the Raffle table so that the responsibility can be shared when one person must take a break.

Louise reported Alfredo painted a fabulous piece for the Raffle, but it was suggested and decided that it would be best to put this vase in the Silent Auction with a minimum bid of \$200. Many thanks to Louise Davis for having him at her home right after Tybee.

Elaine Davis requests that people paint for the Sales Table. White china is OK and it is suggested that it be something unusual not available from the vendors. If you have several small pieces you wish to sell it is suggested that you make a little grab bag out of them.

Gail Craig reported that one thing in the Silent Auction will be Wilma Manhardt's birds. Also Suzanne is contributing items from Fillipe and there will be something here also from Alfredo. Quality items will be available.

Contact Irene Barron with items for the Memorial table. If someone in your club has passed away she will need a framed photo, a written piece about the person, and at least one piece of china they painted.

Louise Davis reported that 14 booth holders are confirmed. Bonnie Mellin will be writing them a welcome letter before the convention and will have a paper hospitality bag on their booth which will contain needed items as well as a Banquet ticket and form they can fill out for Friday and Saturday Box Lunch. Thursday box lunch will be provided.

Clo Farver showed the vase she has painted for the Raffle and Eleanor Weiss showed a hand knitted baby blanket for the Homemade Auction.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:55 PM.

GWOCP Board Meeting March 26, 2009

President Suzanne Painter opened the meeting by asking Winnie Bryant to say a blessing before we partook of the buffet. Following lunch, Suzanne thanked those present for attending. Winnie Bryant gave the devotional.

Suzanne asked for a motion to accept the minutes distributed by e-mail from the previous meeting. Joan Kampschorr so moved, Elaine Davis seconded, and the motion passed.

Laura Lacis, President Elect, reported on developments in the plans for the 2011 convention. Peter Faust cannot stay in the U.S. beyond three weeks, so this time constraint limits our ability to share his travel expenses with those who might wish to have seminars with Peter. Suzanne entertained a motion to invite Peter as a featured artist to the 2011 convention and to pay for ¼ of his travel expenses and his hotel costs during the convention. Before a motion was offered, Louise Davis stated her wish to go on record as not approving of a featured artist. Suzanne pointed out that in 2011 Laura would be President, and it would be her choice whether to have a featured artist or not. Questions arose as to the exact cost of his airfare, but Laura pointed out this was impossible to predict in two year's time, especially with the current world economic conditions. Following this discussion, Elaine Davis moved to ask Peter to our convention in 2011 and to pay ¼ of his airfare and his hotel room during the convention. Peggy McManus seconded, and the motion passed. The convention will be held somewhere in the Atlanta area.

Committee reports began with Suzanne thanking everyone for all the hard work that is being done to get ready for the convention this year. Hospitality Bags are selling well, but we need many more reservations for hotel rooms at Callaway if we are going to meet the required number to use the facilities there. April 15th is the deadline to make a reservation.

Table and Booth rental sales are going very well, and the demo schedule is nearly full (copies of the reports are attached). Ad sales and paint-in sales are ongoing. We may sign up for paint-ins on our registration sheets. Elaine and Peggy passed out a letter of information and instructions concerning the Sales Table, and they encouraged us to paint china to sell. Callaway will have lots of guests during the convention, so it is a good time to sell our art.

The Treasurer's report was given by Sandra Escoc (copy attached). . Anna Holshouser moved to accept the report, Lynette Peterson seconded, and the motion carried.

Patti Hilderbrand passed around the schedule for the registration desk and asked us to sign up to work the desk during the convention.

Suzanne passed out the Club Treasurer's report of membership for next year to the attending club presidents to take to their individual club treasurers. Lynette expressed the hope that with our increase in the number of members that we might be able to send more pieces to the museum in Oklahoma.

Denise Reidlebach pointed out to Suzanne that our convention and show have not been put on Callaway Gardens' website. Despite contacting them three times about this matter, Denise has had no response. Suzanne will bring this up with her contact at the Gardens.

Jeanette Fox reported that everyone would wear a badge for security reasons. Both GWOCP members and guests must have a badge to enter the convention.

Club reports must be mailed to Eloise Pino if not given to Suzanne. It was pointed out that the length of the newsletter made it difficult and expensive for some to print it out. Suzanne will now send a copy by snail mail to all club presidents, but we released Suzanne from a promise to send a copy to all members of GWOCP since this would be enormously expensive. Jane suggested that Eloise put a summary on page 1, and Suzanne suggested that we print out only the pages we need or want.

Clo Farver, Chairperson of the Nominating Committee, gave her committee's report for the 2010 election (copy attached). The slate of officers is Suzanne Painter, President; Vice President, unfilled; President Elect, Laura Lacis; Corresponding Secretary, Eloise Pino; Recording Secretary, Janet Peters; Treasurer, Sandra Escoe; Historian, Kathy Smith; and Auditor, Dee Pine. Suzanne called for a vote on the proposed slate. With the exception of Millen Chinettes which had no representative, all other clubs were represented and voted yes. Jeanette Fox moved to accept the slate and vote, Anna Holshouser seconded, and the motion carried.

There was no new business. Louise Davis moved to adjourn, Jeanette Fox seconded, and the motion passed. We adjourned the Board meeting and the convention meeting began.

How to Mix China Colors

WOCF Library Reprint

After china painting for a few years, most artists find they have acquired quite a few vials of china paint. In writing this article for my students, I hope to help them eliminate this problem. Please keep in mind that each company's paint will vary a little. These colors were mixed with French and German paints. Also, when mixing the colors yourself, you will acquire self-confidence and knowledge about the china colors. This article is written to help you learn to mix colors. You can use dry paint or the paint from your Pallet.

Violet of Iron: 1/2 ruby and 1/2 brown

Yellow green: 1/2 mixing yellow, 1/2 apple green

Green gold: 1/2 yellow green, 1/2 yellow brown

Russian green: 1/2 mixing yellow, 1/2 deep blue green

Shading green: 1/2 dark green, 1/2 deep blue green

Dark pompadour red: to pompadour add just a little violet of iron

Heliotrope: 1/2 deep blue green, 1/2 violet

Banding blue: 1/2 deep blue green, 1/2 violet of gold

Darkest blue: 1/2 banding blue, 1/2 deep blue green

Dark red wine: American beauty, add just a little pompadour

Dark red rose: to rose, add deep purple until you get the desired color

Violet: 1/2 ruby, 1/2 banding blue

Deep purple: 1/3 ruby, 1/3 dark blue, 1/3 violet of gold

Crimson Purple: 1/2 ruby, 1/2 deep violet of gold

Crimson glory: 1/3 elderberry, 1/3 rich fuchsia rose, 1/3 American Beauty

Dark yellow brown: to yellow brown, add a dot of capuchin brown

Chestnut brown: 1/3 yellow red, 1/3 yellow brown, 1/3 Capuchin Brown

Red orange: to light pompadour add violet of iron until desired shade .

Deep orange: to light pompadour red, add yellow brown until desired shade

Coral: to rose add yellow brown, until desired shade

Rust: to yellow brown, add ruby until desired shade
